September 24, 1863. Released at Camp Douglas on May 18, 1865. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Pressley.]

**QUEEN, NATHAN S., Sergeant**

Resided in Haywood County and was by occupation a farmer prior to enlisting in Haywood County at age 36, December 20, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Private. Reported present or accounted for through June 30, 1863. Promoted to Sergeant prior to September 9, 1863, when he was captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Confined at Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 26, 1863. Released at Camp Douglas on June 12, 1865, after taking the Oath of Allegiance.

**REECE, J. F., \_\_\_\_\_**

North Carolina pension records indicate that he served in this company. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Reese.]

**REECE, JEREMIAH, Musician**

Enlisted in Haywood County at age 27, July 12, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Musician (Drummer). Reported present through June 30, 1863. Captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee, September 9, 1863. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Confined at Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 26, 1863. Paroled at Camp Douglas on March 14, 1865. Received at Boulware's Wharf, James River, Virginia, on or about March 21, 1865, for exchange. Hospitalized at Richmond, Virginia, March 21, 1865, with debilitas. Furloughed for thirty days on March 28, 1865. Survived the war. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Reese.]

**REECE, JOHN V., Corporal**

Previously served as Musician in Company F, 25th Regiment N.C. Troops. Enlisted in this company in Haywood County on July 12, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Private. Promoted to Corporal on September 23, 1862. Reported present through June 30, 1863. Captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee, September 9, 1863. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Confined at Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 26, 1863. Released at Camp Douglas on June 16, 1865. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Reese.]

**REESE, WILLIAM FRANKLIN, Private**

Enlisted in Haywood County at age 23, August 15, 1863, for the war. Reported present through December 31, 1863. No further records. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Reece.]

**RENNO, HENRY, Private**

Place and date of enlistment not reported (probably enlisted subsequent to June 30, 1863). Name appears on an extra duty roll which states he was paid on August 10, 1864, for service as a laborer from April 1 through May 28, 1864. Name appears on receipt rolls for clothing dated August 26 and fourth quarter, 1864. No further records. Survived the war. [The correct spelling of his surname may be Reno. He was about 40 years of age in 1863.]

**RICHARDSON, HILLARD, \_\_\_\_\_**

Records of the United Daughters of the Confederacy indicate that he served in this company.

**ROGERS, J. B., Private**

Enlisted in Haywood County on August 15, 1863, for the war. No further records.

**ROGERS, J. M., Private**

Enlisted in Haywood County on August 15, 1863, for the war. No further records.

**ROGERS, JACKSON J., Private**

Resided in Haywood County and was by occupation a farmer prior to enlisting in Haywood County at age 26, July 12, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Corporal. Reported present through August 31, 1862. Reduced to ranks prior to September 1, 1862. Discharged prior to November 1, 1862. Reason discharged not reported.

**ROGERS, MERRITT C., Corporal**

Enlisted in Haywood County at age 19, July 12, 1862, for the war. Mustered in as Private. Promoted to Corporal on September 23, 1862. Reported present through June 30, 1863. Captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee, September 9, 1863. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Transferred to Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 24, 1863. Died at Camp Douglas on January 30, 1864, of "typhoid fever."

**SELLERS, JACOB, Private**

Resided in Haywood County and was by occupation a "renter" prior to enlisting in Haywood County at age 32, July 12, 1862, for the war. Reported present or accounted for through June 30, 1863. Captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee, September 9, 1863. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Transferred to Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 24, 1863. Died at Camp Douglas on October 16, 1863, of "diarrhoea."

**SELLERS, JOHN M., Private**

Resided in Haywood County and was by occupation a day laborer prior to enlisting in Haywood County at age 26, July 12, 1862, for the war. Reported present or accounted for through June 30, 1863. Captured at Cumberland Gap, Tennessee, September 9, 1863. Sent to Louisville, Kentucky. Confined at Camp Douglas, Chicago, Illinois, September 26, 1863. Died at Camp Douglas on or about June 8, 1864, of "smallpox."

**SIMONS, B. H., Private**

Enlisted in this company subsequent to June 29, 1863, for the war. Transferred to Company K, 60th Regiment N.C. Troops, July 30, 1864.

**SIMONS, JAMES, Private**

Enlisted at Greeneville, Tennessee, March 18, 1863, for the war as a substitute for Pvt. Thomas Holland of this company. Reported present but under arrest by order of court-martial on June 15, 1863. Name appears on a receipt roll for clothing dated November 25, 1863. Transferred to Company K, 60th Regiment N.C. Troops, July 30, 1864.

**SINGLETON, SAMUEL P., Private**

Enlisted in Haywood County at age 27, July 12, 1862, for the war. Reported absent on sick furlough on August 27, 1862. Discharged prior to November 1, 1862. Reason discharged not reported. [May have served later as Private in Company F, 25th Regiment N.C. Troops.]
