

## Descendants of JAMES CHAMBERS

### Generation No. 1

1. JAMES<sup>1</sup> CHAMBERS (*SAMUELA*<sup>A</sup>, *REYNOLDS "RUNNELS"*<sup>B</sup>, *ALEXANDER*<sup>C</sup>, *ROBERT*<sup>D</sup>)<sup>1</sup> was born Abt. 1738 in of Virginia, and died Bet. 1792 - 1800 in Pigeon River, Buncombe ( now Haywood) Co., N. Carolina. He married W/O JAMES CHAMBERS Abt. 1755. She was born Bet. 1740 - 1756.

#### Notes for JAMES CHAMBERS:

James Chambers was on the survey team, a chain bearer, which layed out 400 acres on the E. side of the French Broad River for Joseph McDowell. Entered 6 October, 1783. Ent. No. 131, Grant issued 8 December 1787, Grant no. 1081; Zadock Sherman entered 200 acres on the South Side French Braod River "oppsite" mouth of Swanono River joining James McDowell and down French Broad river for complement 10 January 1888. Warrant Issued. That warranty was transferred to James Chambers. Before 1791, James Chambers was living in the part of old Rutherford County on the west side of the mountains and signed a petition to the Governor of North Carolina (with the other citizens who lived there) to set up a new county which would be called Buncombe. Buncombe County was formed in 1791. According to historian W. C. Allen in his book Centinnal of Haywood County, " among the first settlers on Pigeon River were John Davidson and James Chambers, who secured large grants from the State some years after the close of the Revolution. James Chambers was living on his grant previous to 1790, for according to the best information obtainable he died during the year." Joseph Dobson purchased 640 acres on the west side of Pigeon River including the place where James Chambers lived in his lifetime. This deed was dated January 10, 1803. From the deed records we can determine that James Chambers lived somewhere near the upper reaches of the Pigeon River in the vicinity of present day Clyde and Canton. James Chambers (the son?) bought lot #19 for \$100 from John Burton in Morristown (Asheville), Buncombe Co., N. C. on July 20 1797. ( Ref. Buncombe Co. deed index S1-2 pg. 480.) On Oct 21, 1800 James Chambers (the son?) sold the Morristown lot to John Turke for \$100., (Ref. Deed book 5, pg 241); James bought 640 acres of land for 75 Pounds in Buncombe (now Haywood) Co., NC on the West side of the Pigeon River from Joseph Dobson Oct. 20, 1801.(Ref. Buncombe Co. deed index Book 7, pg. 66. (note: 640 acres = 1 square mile); It is fairly certain that our "James Chambers, the first of the name, came to what is now Haywood Co. from Virginia, bought a tract of land on the west side of Pigeon River south of where Canton is now situated. ( Near Clyde and Chambers Mtn.) He had three sons, Joseph, William, & Elihu." as noted pg. 617-

619 The Annals of Haywood Co. N.C. Allen, (It is likely that James had other sons and daughters, others may have been John\*, Phillips\*, Benjamin\* and James\* (Jr.), Margaret\* and Sarah\*, although there is none other than circumstantial evidence to connect them.) These Chambers are marked in this display with an asterick\* to indicate they have not been proved to be children of James Chambers. (Haywood Co. was made from Buncombe Co. in 1808); James Chambers' neighbors were Thomas Abel, John Massy, Jacob Fulbright, and George Cathey. The primary occupation of the early settlers was stock raising and farming, with the main crops being hogs, corn, wheat, oats, potatoes and some tobacco; Buncombe Co. court, first session, April 1792.. "Ordered by the court that.. James Chambers lay off a road from Swannanoa to Benjamin Davids Creek the nearest and best way.. and report to July court; Minutes of Oct. Court, Buncombe Co., N. C. 1792.. James Chambers ordered to serve on the Grand Jury; ordered to serve as jurors Jan. 1793 were William Chambers; " April 1795 session of court, State of N. C. Buncombe Co. This day came Wm. Chambers and made that on the 21st day of January the dwelling house of James Chambers was burnt and William Coyler, sent a small trunk, with William Chambers, and said deposant(sic) put it in his trunk, and has reason to believe was burnt with the rest of the goods in the house. Sworn to and suscribed before the 26th day of Jan. 1795. Wm.(his mark) Chambers." (This was a bond respecting the mines); April Term of Court, Buncombe Co. ordered James Chambers...Ben Hawkins (and others) to lay off a road from the Court house to Johathan McPeters on Hominy Creek and report to July sessions in 1795; The 1800 US Census does not lists an older James Chambers, so he may have died before the census. A James Chambers is listed but is younger, this could be his son. This is the same page as his three sons are listed on. {Page 164 also lists a John Chambers}; The Buncombe Co. court of Oct. term 1795 lists juror as John Chambers; In the October, 1805 term of court letter of administration were recorded, James Chambers decedent, Executors Joseph Chambers & George Cathey. (The Court House fire of 1831 destroyed the wills but Extant Minutes were saved).

#### Notes for W/O JAMES CHAMBERS:

James Chambers' will was probated in 1805 in Buncombe Co., N.C. Abigail Chambers was receiving land grants as early as 1783 probably as a widow of a Rev. Soldier. There is some thought that James' wife was named Abigail but it is not certain. Records show that James was alive in 1791. (He signed a petetion( west of the mountains near Asheville) to form a new county. (County was named Buncombe) Some Abigail Chambers records are: 1. N. C. State Grant# 1080 to Abigail Chambers for 400 acres lying on both sides of Richland Creek...near above John McDowell's survey. Survey including the mouth of a fork on the east side and a Locust Grove in the Forks. Entered 1 December

1783 #139 Surveyed 10 April 1787. Grant issued 8 December 1787. Source= Burke County, N. C. Land Grants. Burke Co. Public Library. (Abigail would probably have been a widow of a Rev. Soldier to receive the grant) 2. Abigail Chambers was the second wife of Capt. Thomas Patton and, at the time of their marriage 14 September, 1800 was member of Piney Grove (now First Presbyterian Church) of Swannanoa, Buncombe Co., N. C. In the 1800 Census of Buncombe County, Thomas Patton, Sr. was over 45 and his wife (Abigail) was 26-44. She would have been born 1756-1774. Thomas Patton died 22 March, 1808 at Pisgah Forest, Transylvania Co., NC leaving Abigail a widow for the second time. She is listed in the 1810 Census of Buncombe Co. as Abigail Patton (widow), age 45-up, (born before 1765) living alone and next house to Joseph Patton age 25-44 (probably Thomas Patton's son). In the 1820 Census of Buncombe Joseph Patton still has in his home a female over 45 which may be Abigail Patton. Abigail does not appear in the 1830 census with Joseph Patton's family.

Richland Creek is probably now known by another name and would rise in west Transylvania (then Buncombe) County, N. C., flowing northeast into the west fork of the French Broad River. (Not to be confused with the Richland Creek of present day Haywood County that flows through the center of Waynesville, N. C. northeast into the Pigeon River.) Abigail Chambers also may have been a sister or mother of Hannah Chambers who married Benjamin Hawkins of the same local. Other records: 1790 Census of Rutherford County, N. C. located in Militia Dist. 13 (probably in what is now Buncombe Co., south of Swannoa River. Abigail Chambers= head of household with following in household. 2 males 16 & up, 1 male under 16, 4 females (all ages). These ages match up with Elihu and William being over 16, and Joseph being under 16. 1 female being Abigail and the 3 other females are unknown. Thomas Patton was born 1726 in Chester Co. Pa. or Cecil Co., Md. moving to what is now Franklin Co., Pa where he married Margaret Erwin (Irvin). Thomas was in Augusta Co., Va. in 1755. He then appears in the vicinity of Bethel congregation, York Dist, S. C. in the 1760's, moving on to present day Buncombe Co., N. C. in 1785. After Margaret's death (about 1792) Thomas married the widow Abigail Chambers, 1796/7 and moved to the Davidson River valley near the present town of Pisgah Forest. He died there 22 March 1808 and is buried in the Davidson River Cemetery.

**2.** ELIHU<sup>2</sup> CHAMBERS (*JAMES*<sup>1</sup>, *SAMUELA*, *REYNOLDS "RUNNELS"*<sup>B</sup>, *ALEXANDER*<sup>C</sup>, *ROBERT*<sup>D</sup>)<sup>1,2,3,4</sup> was born 1765 in prob Va., and died Aft. 1860 in prob. Haywood County, N.C.. He married MISS GLLISPIE?<sup>5</sup> Abt. 1790 in North Carolina. She was born Bet. 1775 - 1777, and died Bet. 1814 - 1850.

#### Notes for ELIHU CHAMBERS:

In April Term of Court, Buncombe Co., N. C. witness my hand and seal this 24th day of April 1795. ...Elihu Chambers. Elihu bought land in Buncombe County, North Carolina recorded in Buncombe County deed books on three different times. 1st, he purchased an unknown amount of land in 1796 in Morristown (Asheville) from William Davidson which may have been a new city lot that had been recently layed out. 2nd, he purchased 30 acres on Pigeon River in 1802 from Thomas Dever. 3rd, he bought 200 acres on Pigeon River in 1805 from James Bobit. Oct . After Haywood County was made in 1808, Elihu was a resident of that county without moving. He and Thomas Foster, Jr. bought fifty acres of land on the west side of Pigeon River opposite Flowery Gardens (now Center Pigeon) for \$125 on Oct. 8, 1811, from Joseph Sorrels. This was next to the plantation where Elihu lived, Joshua Kinworthy was a witness to the deed for Josphe Sorrels. Term of Court , Buncombe Co. 1803.."mark a smooth crap off the right ear and an under keel out of the under side of the left ear" ..Stock brands entered in court for Elihu Chambers. Elihu was listed in the 1800 Census of Buncombe and 1810 Census of Haywood (old Buncombe) Co., N. Carolina. "Early in the 19th century Elihu Chambers and son William removed from Haywood County, N. C. to Habersham County, Ga. Elihu had fought through the Revolutionary war including the battle of King's Mountain."(History of Walker Co., Ga.) "Elihu was almost a giant in stature, a man of great strength and moral, as well as physical courage."(Annals of Haywood Co., N. C.) Haywood County court records indicate that nuisance charges by the state were brought against Elihu Chambers and Andrew Welch. Both were found guilty in 1811. Then as now, people resorted to the civil law suits to settle boundary line

disputes, fights between men and quarrels between neighbors. It is said that he outlived his wife. In the 1850 Census of Haywood County Elihu was widowed, and 85 years old and lived with John and Julian Bonan and children. In the 1860 Census of Haywood Co., N.C., Elihu was 95 years old and widowed and living in his home was Samuel and Sophia Chambers, his grandson and wife. Elihu's real estate was valued at \$9,000.00 and personal belongings at \$1500.00 in 1860.

Va., and died 21 Sep 1844 in Cooper Co., Mo. age 78. He married UNK. WIFE OF W. CHAMBERS, SR. Abt. 1795 in prob. Va or N. Carolina. She died Bet. 1816 - 1844.

Notes for WILLIAM CHAMBERS, SR.:

July Term court 1775, Buncombe Co., N.C...A deed from William Chambers to Benjamin Hawkins for 300 acres of land on French Broad River was acknowledged in open court and ordered to be registered. On Apr 24, 1796 William bought 400 acres near the mouth of Swananoa River from Thomas Patton. On Jul 15, 1796 640 acres of land in Buncombe County was granted to George Cathey & Willis (William?) Chambers. (From the Annals of Haywood Co., N.C.).."William was a man of adventure, went to the northwest, engaged in the Indian Wars in that early period, had many narrow escapes but finally settled down the Middle West and made his home there.." 1810 Census of Haywood Co., N. C. lists William with 8 children and 1 slave. William owned a considerable amount of land a record purchases of which follows: Buncombe Co., N. C. Sept 25, 1795 to William Chambers et al, from Antoni, Martin 620 acres Richland Creek, book 4 pg 408; Apr 24, 1796 from Thomas Patton, 400 acres near mouth of Swananoa River, book 3 pg 94; Dec 2, 1797 from State of N. C. No 352, 150 acres Turkey Creek, recorded Feb 28 1812.(This is the same land he sold to William Hawkins Aug 10, 1798.); Dec 14, 1803 to William Chambers et al 400 acres on Richland Creek from State of N.C. No 1153, recorded Nov 1 1807; Dec 5, 1806 from State of N.C. No 1530, 300 acres on Pigeon River, recorded Jan 16 1808 book 3pg 416. William wrote his will on Oct. 19, 1842 in Cooper Co., Mo. The will was recorded Nov. 15, 1844. He mentions sons; William Chambers, John Chambers, Samuel Chambers. He mentions daughters; Elizabeth Chambers, Hannah (Chambers) Carpenter, widow of Robert Carpenter deceased, Martha (Chambers) George, wife of Lewis George, and Abigail Chambers. He also mentions; to my sons; Joseph Chambers, and James Chambers. He also mentions; to my son in law; Peter Carpenter. His friend Jeremiah Rice was the executer of the will. The will was witnessed by Ferry Rockwell, William H. Trigg, Robert Stuart.

JOSEPH<sup>2</sup> CHAMBERS** (*JAMES<sup>1</sup>, SAMUELA, REYNOLDS "RUNNELS"<sup>B</sup>, ALEXANDER<sup>C</sup>, ROBERT<sup>D</sup>*)<sup>7,8,9,10,11</sup> was born 18 Jun 1778 in Virginia, and died Bef. 03 Aug 1840 in Villa Rica, Carroll Co., Ga. bd. Chambers Burying Ground (Hillcrest Cem.). He married SARAH C. MOODY<sup>12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19</sup> Abt. 1800 in prob. Buncombe Co., N. Carolina<sup>20</sup>, daughter of JESSE MOODY and DINAH HOLLINGSWORTH. She was born 20 Dec 1782 in Haw River, Chatham Co., N. Carolina, and died 05 Sep 1860 in Villa Rica, Carroll Co., Ga. bd. Chambers Burying Ground (Hillcrest Cem..

Notes for JOSEPH CHAMBERS:

Joseph is enumerated in Buncombe Co., N. C. in 1800 in the Morgan Dist. He was 22 years old and his wife Sarah was 17. They had no children. There was a male living with them between the ages of 16-26. It is unknown who this male was. The earliest record of Joseph is for a land grant of 640 acres In Buncombe

Co., N.C. (From a survey of Jul 15, 1796 which included 43,534 acres). From Early History of Haywood Co. Page 1, "Joseph Chambers deserves mention of early political leaders, He served this county as a member of the House for four terms, in 1813, 1815, 1819, 1820. He also was member of the old Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, and held other offices or places of public trust. Joseph was one of the three sons of James Chambers, one of our very earliest pioneers, lived on Pigeon River, South Canton." From the Annals of Haywood Co., N. C...."James... had three sons, Joseph, William and Elihu. Joseph was perhaps the best known of them. He was a member of the State Legislature four terms 1813,1815,1819, and 1821. He was a faithful and patriotic representative of the county during those years... Haywood County's Soldiers in the War of 1812...Another company was enrolled in 1814 and detached from the Seventh Regmt. William Cathey, a distinguished soldier from Haywood Co., was made 1st Major of the regiment, and Thomas Lenoir, also of the county, was made 2nd Major. The full detail of the company follows; James Chambers, William chambers, Joseph Chambers,.... This company of seventy-two men and officers was ordered on Jan 25, 1815, to rendezvous at Wadesboro, N. Carolina, where they remained until some time in May of that year when they were mustered out of service." [From the book, Moody Family..., by F. Moody Nadeau]: " Joseph Chambers, who was married to Elizabeth (actually Sara), one of John and Reuben's (Moody) sisters, had moved to Haywood Co., from Virginia with his father, James Chambers and his two brothers, William and Elihu." Joseph lived at Morristown (now Asheville), then near Canton on Richland Creek, then Jonathan's Creek, and then later, maybe briefly at Franklin, Macon Co., N. C. (1830 Census) On Dec 14, 1803 Joseph and his brother William were granted a patented deed from the State of N. Carolina #1153 for 400 acres on Richland Creek , a water way of Pigeon River, Buncombe Co.,( now Haywood Co.) They paid the state of N. C. 50 shillings per 100 acres (Ref. Buncombe Co. Deed recorded Nov 1, 1807 Book 3, pg. 399. The deed stated that Joseph lived in a Locust grove on that land and had "entered " (applied for) the land on 21 October 1801. From this deed we can conclude that Joseph moved on this land sometime around 1801, shortly after he had married Sarah Moody. On June 26, 1809, Joseph was among the Grand Jurors selected in the first term of court ever held in Haywood County, N. C. In Oct. 1807 Joseph bought 340 acres of land from Robert Love & James Davidson on Jonathans Creek in the same county. (Recorded March 13, 1808; Deed book 7, pg. 633). Joseph appears to have moved his family the the Jonathan Creek property were he probably remained until 1832 with he and all his children sold out and moved to the Gold country at Villa Rica, Georgia. On Jan 16,1808 Joseph and William sold to Robert Love 186 acres on Richland Creek for \$1,190. In the 1810 Census of Haywood Co. Joseph is listed with wife and 4 children and 2 slaves. According to Deed book B-448 in Haywood County, in January, 1827 Joseph Chambers sold a slave to



Gideon Allmon. (In a speech delivered by Col. A. T. Davidson at the Lyceum, Friday Night, Nov. 7, 1890 Davidson said) "I was born in Jonathan's Creek, Haywood Co., N.C. in 1819 (Jonathan Creek made a township in 1869) and the country at that time was a vast mountain wilderness- only then about twenty years from the first settlement of the country...the neighbors of my father were...John and Reuben Moody, brothers, all sturdy, hardy, well-to-do men, and good citizens. Joseph Chambers of this neighborhood, who moved to Georgia about the first of the opening and discovery of the Carroll County gold mine, say about 1831 or '32. He was a man of more than ordinary character, led in public affairs, raised an elegant family for the times; his daughters marrying well. They were splendid ladies, and thier descendants belong to some of the best families in Georgia. (note: Three of Joseph's son-in-laws were appointed as commissioners for the town of Villa Rica by the Georgia Legislature at the time of Villa Rica's incorporation in December, 1842.) His wife was a sister of John and Reuben Moody.... they (the inhabitants) manufactured all their wearing apparel, tanned their own leather, made their axes and plows, and, in short, bought nothing from the stores except iron. In fact, they had nothing to buy with. There was but one post office in the county...All the necessaries of life were procured from the markets in Georgia and S. Carolina. It was a three week's trip with a wagon to Augusta, Ga. For this market the neighborhood would bunch their products, bring their forces together and make trips to Augusta, loaded with bacon, peltries and such other marketable articles as would bear transportation in this simple way. The return for these products was sugar, coffee, salt and molasses and happy was the family on the return of the wagons to be able to have a jug full of New Orleans black molasses; and how happy the children were to meet their fathers and brothers again, and have them recite the many stories of the trip. It was interesting to see the people meet to get from the wagons their portion of the return load; and happy was the small family that got a half bushel of salt, 50 cents worth of coffee and a gallon of molasses. There was general rejoicing, all going home satisfied and happy, content with their small cargoes, and satisfied that they had enough to do them for the next year....Joseph Chambers, of whom I have spoken, represented the county for three sessions in the legislature." Carroll Co., Ga. deed book pg. 225 shows James Dickson sold to Allmon (-) Chambers & Co. on 7 Feb, 1832, for \$700.00, land lot #235, 2nd dist. (now Douglas Co.) It is of interest that Joseph's daughter, Nancy, married Nelson A. Allman in 1827 in Buncombe Co., N. C.. This joint owner Company may have been Nelson Allman and Joseph Chambers. After Joseph moved to Hixstown (Villa Rica), Ga. his daughter Mary, was the first marriage recorded in book C-1 Carroll Co. Ga. 6 Dec. 1832. Joseph witnessed a deed in Carroll Co., Ga. 29 Oct. 1832. On 21 Nov. 1832 in Deed Book pg. 227 of Carroll Co...Jesse Lane, Oliver Clarke, Reuben Cone and William Ezzard, of Dekalb Co.,(sold) to Joseph Chambers and Jesse H.

Chambers for \$3,000 land lot #195, 6th dist. (about 1 mile NW of new Villa Rica) except 60 feet sold to William Dixon, John Sheppard and Allen Tolbert. On 21 Nov. 1832 Joseph and Jesse signed a promissory note(Pg. 257) as follows.. "Joseph and Jesse Chambers to Jesse Lane, Reuben Cone, Oliver Clark and William Ezzard, Dekalb Co. \$5.00. A part of land lot #195, 6th dist. Carroll , land lot #235 2nd dist. Carroll (now Douglas CO.) where the widow of James Dickson lives, plus ten Negroes, Peonelope, and children Betsy, King, Seth, Dove, Annette, about 22, Andy a boy, Bob about 23 years old, and Nathan. To secure promissory note, \$3500.00, Chambers to Lane et al. Attest: George S. Moody, Denison B. Palmer, Charles Hulsey, J.P. 21 Jan 1833." (This was the Gold Mine Purchase). Joseph's occupations were miner, farmer and State Senator (Haywood Co., N.C.) His will: "State of Georgia-Carroll County. I Joseph Chambers of the county and state aforesaid being of sound and perfect mind and memory, Bless be God, do this 17th day June in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty nine make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say, first I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph W. Chambers one thousand dollars in money or good property to be paid when he arrives at the age of twenty one years by his mother Sarah Chambers or her agent which is to hold said money as property until that time. And I also give unto my daughter Sarah L. Chambers Eight hundred dollars which is in the hands of Sarah Chambers her mother to be in like manner paid whenever she thinks best so to do so as to not exclude from said property after she becomes of age. I furthermore state that the above amount to be given to my son Joseph and daughter Sarah to be equivalent to that which I have heretofore left to by lawful heirs which they have received from me to viz(;) John T Chambers, Jesse H. Chambers, Nancy A Chambers, Nicholas F. Chambers, William Chambers, Elizabeth Chambers, Mary Chambers, Hannah Chambers, and Ann Chambers. I further give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Chambers after settling all my just debts which I owe the remaining part of all the property both personal and real Estate with the exception of a Negro boy by the name of George which I give to my son Nicholas F. Chambers to be his own right and property to have and to hold from the claims of any other person or persons lawfully claiming the same and the said Sarah Chambers is to have the residue of all which may be left after settling my just debts to her own use and benefit in any way that she thinks best to make her comfortable.....be divided equally between all her heirs and furthermore I grant Sarah Chambers my wife the access to dig or cause to be dug in the Gold mine on lot one hundred and ninety five in the sixth district of the aforesaid county and also all those that have or may have a good and sufficient tittle to a part of the aforesaid lot until the death of my wife Sarah and then the part which I hold to be sold at the highest bidder and the proceeds to be divided equal amoung all the aforesaid heirs and I hereby make and ordain my son John T. Chambers and N. F.

Chambers Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Joseph Chambers have to this my last will and testament set by hand and seal the day and year above written. Attest: Jesse H. Chambers - William Chambers. Signed: Joseph Chambers." Will was proven in court 3rd day of August, 1840 by the oaths of Jesse H. Chambers and William Chambers. Joseph was probably the first person to be buried in the Chambers "burying ground", now known at Hillcrest Cemetery, Villa Rica, Ga. After Sara died, September 5, 1860, John T. as executor, filed a petition with the Ordinary Court in Carrol County for "leave to sell land belonging to the Estate of Jospheh Chambers deceased...be granted to John T. Chambers the Executor of the last will and said deceased to sell...to wit: four tenths of the undivided one fourth of the said half of lot of land no. 195 in the 6th Dist. of said county including all mineral and mining privileges therin. This Dec. 1st 1884. R. L. Richards, Ordinary.C.C."

#### Notes for SARAH C. MOODY:

According to the minutes of the New Hope Primitive Baptist Church, at Villa Rica, Georgia, Sarah was Received By Letter on Sept 6, 1834 from Mount Zion Church, Haywood County, N. C.. Her letter was withdrawn from the Mount Zion Church on June 21, 1832. From this document we know that Joseph and Sarah had anticipated the move to Georgia when she withdrew her letter and had moved some time between July and December 1832. Sara C. was enumerated as head of household in the 1840 Census of Carroll County, Joseph having died earlier in 1840. Sarah was listed on the 1842 tax digest of Carroll Co. She was living in the house of her son Nicholas F. Chambers in the 1850 Census. She was listed on the 1853 tax digest, section 642-2. She was living with her daughter Hannah Harrison June 5th 1860 Census. Sarah died Sept 5, 1860 probably in Hannah's home. Hannah and Abe's home place was about 1 mile out the Dallas Hwy. from Villa Rica, Ga. on the left, 1st house before the Rabun place. The house was standing as late as the 1970's. Sarah gave her birth place as S. C. on the 1860 census. Sarah is buried beside her husband Joseph at the Chambers burying ground (Hillcrest Cem.) at Villa Rica, Carroll Co., Georgia.

Notes for SARAH L. CHAMBERS:

1850 Census Carroll County, Georgia.. age 36 born Georgia. After eight years of marriage (1850 Census) there were no children. An interesting anecdote by Sherrell Hall on her family website at ancestry.com: "During a recent visit to Liberty Hill Cemetery in Acworth, Ga. a woman who lived across the street came over and introduced herself. She seemed very knowledgeable about the cemetery and some of the more famous people interred there. She commented that after Merrell Awtrey's death his wife Sarah had him pickled and placed in a glass top coffin! He was then interred in a brick mausoleum where she visited and spoke with him daily until she declined into mental illness. She died in 1895 and was also interred in the mausoleum. The mausoleum did not stand up well to time and the elements and finally an entire wall collapsed. Merrell and Sarah were then buried in the ground with simple markers provided by the county/cemetery. I have photos of the mausoleum ruin and the simple stones that now mark the graves. I cannot vouch for the accuracy of this story but it is interesting and makes a wonderful anecdote...."

Notes for MERRELL C. AWTRY:

In 1844 Merrell was dealing in real estate in the old city of Villa Rica. Carroll County deed records: 10 January 1844, Edmund W. Holland agent for David Clopton, Edward A. Broddus, Benjamin Chapman, Edw. W. Holland, Joseph Chambers, Jessie H. Chambers, and Clayton Williams to Merrell C. Awtry. \$91.67. 11/12 of four undivided town lots of Villa Rica, Georgia. Land lot #193, 6th Dist. Carroll Co. lots # 17, 18, 19, 21. 60 feet in the front, 200 back of the Main Street. #18 north side, rest on south side. Attest: R. C. Williams, R.V.C. Ruffin, J.P. filed 22 January 1844. Merrell C. was received into the New Hope Primitive Baptist Church by emersion 25 May, 1839. He was on the 1842 tax digest of Carroll County, Georgia. Was in 1850 Census Carroll County, occupation merchant. He was dismissed by letter from New Hope Church 24 May, 1851. At about this time he and Sarah moved to Acworth, Cobb Co., Ga. where he is shown in the 1860 census of Acworth as a merchant. His real estate value in 1860 was \$2500 and his personal value was \$20,000 . In 1870 Merrell and Sarah are now living in the Kenesaw Dist. and he is a dry goods merchant, and now after the Civil war his real estate value had fallen to \$100 and personal value to \$5,000 . Also living in the home are Millie Awtrey 30, a black woman employed as a cook and her three black children.

Notes for JAMES \* CHAMBERS:

There appears more than one James Chambers in Buncombe and Haywood Counties, N. C. about the turn of the century to 1800. It is difficult to discern between them and they are listed here simply to try and sort them out. James Chambers is enumerated in the 1800 Census in Morgan Dist. of Buncombe Co., N.C. along with William, Elihu, Joseph, and John Chambers. It is not certain this James is son of James Chambers, the father of William, Elihu, and Joseph. James Chambers was a member of the "detached Militia of North Carolina" organized in August, 1814. He was listed with the 73 soldiers from Haywood County along with William Chambers and Joseph Chambers. a James Chambers was enumerated 1800 and again 1820 and 1830 census in Haywood Co., N. C. Haywood county administration records indicate that (a) James Chambers and his wife were possibility decease around 1810 because of the following record as quoted by J. T. Webb in her book: Haywood County A Brief History, " The court ordered Jacob Shook and John Fulbright to make an inventory of the estate of John Chambers. Phillip T. Burford was appointed guardian of Mary Chambers and John Chambers, the two older children of the six orphans of James Chambers. Burford had in his possession notes from George Cathey and Joseph Chambers for \$115.09 1/2, from James Walker for \$2.02, from John Patton Jr. for \$2.12, from James McKee for \$92.12 and from Joseph Chambers for \$7.00. There was also listed; one feather bed, one bolster, two pillows, two sheets, two counterpanes, one glen pot and one bed quilt. Mary Chambers had not received money for work she had done. Finally, William Deaver was appointed guardian to Rachel, George, William David and James Chambers - four orphan children under the age of fourteen years of James Chambers. Deaver received \$409.02 from the estate for the children's care."

Jonathan's house listed a male 50-60 which could have been his father Phillips. Phillip Chambers of Hall County was a fortunate drawer in the April 27, 1827 Land Lottery in Georgia. He drew LL 102, (202 1/2 acres) District 5, Carroll County. Phillips was living in the home of Jonathan Chambers in the 1850 Census of Carroll Co., Ga. Age 72

In the 1840 Census of Cherokee Co., N. C. is a Benjamin Chambers, with a total of seven persons in his home. Two male sons, Two female daughters, Benjamin, and a female his age who was probably his wife. Benjamin was widowed, aged 67, in 1850 in Cherokee Co., N. C. He was a farmer. Living in the next house to him was Newton B. Chambers age 23 and his wife and three small children. Newton was very likely helping him farm and was very likely his son.

Born in Jonathan's Creek, N. C., John T. migrated from Haywood Co., N. C. down to Chevestown (Villa Rica), Carroll Co., Ga. at about age 31 with his wife and his first three children who were born in N. C. John's occupations were gold miner, farmer, tanner and State Senator from Carroll Co., Ga. (before the Civil War). He was one of the earliest settlers in Chevestown, coming there about 1833 or 34 shortly after the gold strike. His father Joseph may have come to Chevestown as early as 1831. John bought into some of the mines and one mine that he owned is today buried under the Villa Rica Community Building at the Gold Dust Park. Ref. "Georgia's Last Frontier" by James C. Bonner ...'Carroll County's mining history began in 1830, soon after the county was settled. In that year gold was discovered at Pine Mtn., a short distance north of the future site of Villa Rica. This community was originally known as Hixtown, named for William Hix, who had operated a tavern and a general store there before 1830. By 1832 several hundred men were employed annually in the mines, which produced an annual average of 25,000 pennyweights of gold for the next few years. (A pennyweight was 1/20 of an ounce and valued at approximately one dollar.) The principal mining belt was situated on lots 155,165,166,192,193,194, and 195 in the Third Land Dist. The ore-bearing veins were numerous varying from a few inches to several feet in thickness. These often expanded into pockets containing many tons of high-grade ore. The mining process used before the Civil War was the simple placer method with hand rockers, in which unskilled Negro labor was employed. Each hand averaged from two to twenty pennyweights per day'..... In an article written circa 1908 describing the Gold mines in Carrol Co. by an unknown mineralogist: "Chambers Mine- This mine, on lot 195, 6th district, adjoins the Jones track and is about a mile northwest of Villa Rica. Considerable mining has been prosecuted on an auriferous quartz vein at this locality and surface washing, covering an area of a number of acres, has also been done. An open cut was made before the Civil War on the vein referred to and was enlarged in the course of more recent mining operation. Some shafts were also sunk on the vein. The cut is about a hundred and fifty yards long. At one point, where a small portion of ground was left standing for a passage way a limited exposure of the vein is to be seen. At this point it shows a thickness of about four feet. No work has been done on the vein for a number of years and it could not be ascertained what gold was obtained when mining operations were being carried on. A limited amount of work was done near this vein in 1908. These operations consisted in surface washing near the northwest side of the vein. The material was carried in a flume across the open cut and washed by machinery situated on the southeast side. Work had been suspended before the property was visited and it was not learned what success attended this mining. Near the southwest end of the cut

surface washing was done years ago over an area of a number of acres. According to those who have worked at the locality, a number of small comparatively rich pockets have been found in the vicinity of the main vein. The gold in these is said to have been in very thin quartz veins, or quartzose layers in the decomposed rock." Ref. Georgia's Last Frontier..... 'Closely identified with Carroll County's mining history was the town of Villa Rica, a Spanish phrase which literally means "rich village". The town was incorporated in 1842 on lot 193, a short distance north of its present location along the Norfolk Southern RR. Ezekiel S. Candler, whose descendants were to achieve an unusual degree of prominence in Georgia, ( Asa beginner of Coca Cola Company) was among the original commissioners of the town. However, the old town was known more for its vices than for the prominence of its citizens. Many street fights and violent deaths occurred on its noisy old streets, which later reverted to silence and decay. One early settler recalled seeing forty men engaged in a drunken street brawl. Here John Murrill, the noted gambler and highwayman, is said to have dwelt for some time. It was here that old man Chatmans, while sleeping off a drunk, had his throat cut by a midnight assailant. Here also the old circus master, John Roberson, once spread his tent under which the world famous clown, Dan Rice, shook the lively miners with laughter'... In the 1870's the railroad came to Carroll and missed Old Villa Rica (Hixtown) by about two miles. Soon a new Villa Rica sprung up by the tracks and was incorporated in 1881. By 1890 the old town had dwindled to 300 and the new town now boasted 700 inhabits. Some merchants in the old town put their stores on skids and moved to the new town. By 1895 the increased depth and scarcity of ore in the vicinity made mining unprofitable. John T. volunteered for enlistment 21st May 1836 as a Pvt. to fight in the Creek Indian War of 1836. He was a Member of the 74th Regmt. of Ga. Militia at Carrollton, Carroll Co., Ga. The company consisted of 66 enlisted men and 12 officers and was known as the Thomas Bonner Company. On June 6th, 1836, the first night out of Carrollton going to the war the regiment camped at Camp Odum, about 4 miles SE of Carrollton (now the Blandenburg Rd.) Thomas Bonner was the Capt., Emanuel B. Martin 2nd Lt. and Wm. L. Parr was Col.(commander).(Carroll Historical Qtrly. 1968). The soldiers marched to Columbus, the place named as rendezvous for all the troops. It was at Girard, near Columbus that the army of ten thousand gathered. There were seven companies of infantry organized into a battalion with William Wood of Heard County as Lt. Colonel; John Chambers of Carroll County as Major. John had signed a six month enlistment. The Creeks were defeated and moved out of Georgia in 1836. The Cherokees were removed in 1838. William W. Merrell volunteered and was appointed 1st Sergeant, his account is from his "Personal Notes of William W. Merrell 1880...his school days were then brought to a sudden close by the breaking out of the Seminole & Creek Wars. He



volunteered in Capt. William L. Parr's Company of 'Carroll Volunteers' as first sergeant about the 1st of June, 1836, to serve in the regmt. of Ga. Militia Volunteers commanded by Col. Calhoun, Battalion commanded by Major John T. Chambers. We marched to West Point, Georgia and were there mustered into the United States service for the term of three months and were stationed near that place on the state line of Alabama, where we remained in said service until about the 27th of August, 1836, when we were honorably discharged, for the reason the Government of the U. S. no longer needed our services." John T. was appointed on a committee at New Hope Primitive Baptist Church on July 6 1837 to select a place where the meeting house was to be built. He was appointed a Trustee of the church July 23, 1837. He was received into the church by emission 24 June 1839. John T. was appointed clerk of the New Hope Primitive Baptist Church on August 25, 1839. "Distributions by church 22 Feb., 1840. John T. and his wife Lucinda were "Excumicated April 5th 1845 for Communing with the Missionary Baptist." He was on the 1842 tax digest of Carroll Co. being listed in section 642 2. He owned 2 slaves and reported as agent for Sarah Chambers (his mother) 6 slaves. In the 1842 Tax list John has 303 3/4 acres and Sarah had 485 usable acres in Carroll County. In 1843 John was elected State Senator from West Georgia. In 1850 John owned 5 slaves, all females, ages 25, 20, 5, 3, 6mos. John was listed on the 1853 tax digest of Carroll County. In the 1850 Census of Carrroll his occupation was listed as "mechanic" and real estate value at \$4,000. In 1854 John was a member of the Villa Rica Masonic Lodge #72 In the 1860 Census, with his real estate value at \$7,000 and personal value at \$6,700, and living next house from his sister Hannah and her husband Abel H. Harrison. His son Jesse was living in his household with personal value at \$500. Jesse married the next April (1861). Also living in John's house in 1850 was Miriah Gordon age 18 born in Georgia. It is unknown who Mirah Gordon was. The 1860 Slave Schedule Census for Carroll Co. listed John as owning slaves. In the 1870 Census, (after the slaves were freed), there were listed in John's household Charity Rowe a mulatto and her daughter Georgia J. Charity was a "domestic servant". John at age 58 led the 1st volunteers for the Confederates from Carroll Co. to the Civil War in 1861. He organized Company I known as the "Villa Rica Gold Diggers" and served as their Captain until October 3, 1862 when at age 59 he resigned because of failing health. His rank was listed Capt. Asst Qtr Master. Four of his sons served under his command and two more sons joined other commands. The 19th Georgia Infantry, CSA was assembled during the summer of 1861. Company I mustered in June 22, 1861 under a big tree at the Haynes home place (now the Dallas Highway) in Villa Rica, Ga. The 19th Ga. Inf. companies were raised in Henry, Jackson, Coweta, Carroll, Mitchell, and Bartow Counties. Comprising of 900 men, the unit was sent to Va. and placed in the Potomac District. In April 1862, it totalled 395 effectives and during the war served under

the command of Generals W. Hampton, Archer, and Colquitt. It was in Hoke's Div., Anderson's Core . John made \$300 month as Capt. He was at Camp Johnson, Va. at one time. The 19th Ga. Inf. fought in many battles from Seven Pines to Chancellorsville, then moved to Charleston, S. Carolina, and later Florida where it took part in the conflict at Olustee. In April, 1864, it returned to Va. and continued the fight at Drewry's Bluff and Cold Harbor and in the Petersburg lines south and north of the James River. This regiment lost 32 killed and 157 wounded during the Seven Days' Battles, 13 killed and 76 wounded in the Maryland Campaign, and 3 killed and 40 wounded at Chancellorsville. It sustained 96 casualties at Olustee, Fla.. In 1865 the unit participated in the N. Carolina Campaign and surrendered with the Army of Tennessee. Two of John's sons died from wounds. John brought them, 5th Sgt. Benjamin D. and Pvt. Merrill C. back from Virginia in a wagon, their bodies covered with lime, and buried them in a common grave in the Chambers Grave Yard. Carroll Co. furnished 2, 560 soldiers for the Confederate Army, more than 50% of her white male population. In the 1870 Census John's real estate value had declined to \$1,800 and personal value to \$400. Of interest is the note the Census enumerator made on the census last page, he wrote: "This district contains the most sober, civilized and religious people I ever fell amongst, poor but honest, and pays their debts. No law on their docket for twelve months past; Lands more fertile and less rocky than Kansas Dist." Letter dated July 22, 1872- Villa Rica, Ga.: "R. J. Gaines to Major Richardson...I will commense with what is known in this county as the 'Chambers Lead' some 5 miles in length, with outcroppings at various points. Copper has been cut on the Hill porperty at a depth of 95 feet disclosing a vein of yellow sulphurete of copper some 8 ft in width. Adjoining this mine is the Chambers porperty, upon which has been sunk a shaft of about 100 ft.with a similar result to that of the Hill shaft..." Carroll County Times June 2, 1873: "Sale Day...At the Sheriff's sale at 11;00 o'clock the property of John T. Chambers was sold to B. M. Long for \$230". Carroll County Times Aug 31, 1877: "Mr. John T. Chambers has discovered a very rich asbestos mine on his plantation one mile from Villa Rica on the road leading to Carrollton. We wish the old Captain success and that he will reap a rich harvest. Prof. S. J. Williams of New York is superintending the work and is shipping the ore. I have not learned where to yet." By the time the 1880 census was taken, John had been widowed for about 4 months and was living with his daughter Sara and her husband Benjamin Garrison, along with their four children. John is buried at the same Chambers 'burying ground', now known as Hillcrest Cem. Villa Rica, Ga. The old home place was near the old rock graves at the highest point of the present day cemetery.

Notes for LUCINDA MALVINA HAWKINS:

There are some who believe Lucinda's mother Hannah was a Chambers before

she married Benjamin Hawkins. If Hannah was a Chambers and the sister of Joseph Chambers, then Lucinda would marry her 1st cousin John Thaddus Chambers. Lucinda was born in N. Carolina and Married John T. Chambers in N. Carolina. Ben Hawkins Bible has her name spelled Lucindy but in Lucinda's family Bible she spelled it Lucinda. Lucinda was 17 years old when her father died and a few months later when she was 18 her mother died. She married at age 19 yrs & 11 mos. When John and Lucindy moved from N. Carolina to Villa Rica, Georgia, they did not move alone, John's father and mother and all of John brothers and sisters made to move to Georgia with them. Also Lucindy's brother Littleberry and his wife and family moved to the gold field also. So even though they were about 250 miles from their home in North Carolina, they brought several of their kin with them. Lucindy Chambers is listed as a member of New Hope Primitive Baptist Church, Villa Rica for the years between 1838-1851. Lucinda and John had 14 children of which 12 were boys and 2 girls. Obituary in the "Carroll County Times" 9 April 1880 states that "Mrs. Chambers, wife of Captain John T. Chambers, living near Villa Rica, died on Saturday last, and was buried on Monday. She was some 70 years of age at the time of her death." She was listed in the 1880 Mortality Schedule for Carroll Co. "age 71, born N. C., father born in Va., mother born in N. C. died of General Debility". She is buried in the 'Chambers burying ground' Villa Rica, Ga.

Benjamin was probably named for his Uncle Benjamin Garrison or his grandfather Benjamin Hawkins. He was a 5th Sgt. CSA Co I, 19th Ga Inf. Entered service June 22, 1861. Sworn in under a big tree in neighbor Haynes yard. Wounded the 26th June, 1862 in battle of Mechanicsville Va. which was a part of the "Seven Days' Battle. Died from wounds 28 July, 1862 while in the 4th Ga. Hospital, Richmond, Va. CSA Settlement filed Aug. 1, 1862 \$124.86. Marriage to Jane Barr not documented. Tradition is that his father John T. Chambers brought his body home from Virginia covered in lime, in a wagon, and buried him in the same grave with his brother Pvt Merrell Chambers who also died in the war in Virginia. The are buried at the Chambers burying ground, now known as the Hillcrest Cemetery, Villa Rica, Ga.

Notes for PRIVATE MERELL COLUMBUS CHAMBERS, PVT.:

Merrell was probably named for his Uncle Merrell C. Awtry. He was a volunteer in the CSA Army. Pvt. Co I, 19th Ga. Inf. Enlisted and sworn in June 22, 1861 under a big tree at neighbor Haynes yard near Villa Rica, Ga. He died May 31, 1862 during Gen. Jackson's Shenandoah Valley Campaign, near Camp Winder, Richmond, Va. Cause of death unknown. Documents show he is buried in Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Va. CSA Settlement filed Aug. 1, 1862 paid \$36.00 to Capt. J. T. Chambers, his father. Family tradition is that after he died in the War, his father brought his body home to Villa Rica, Ga. covered in lime in a wagon and buried him with his brother, 5th Sgt. Benjamin Chambers whose body was also on the wagon. Tradition is that both boys were buried in the same grave. The old rock graves in the Villa Rica Hillcrest Cemetery once contained chisled names and dates, but are unreadable today after over 148 years.

Notes for JESSE H. CHAMBERS:

Jesse was the adventurer of his father's family. He was venturing out to new lands and new places as we can learn from the trail he left. in 1830 at age 25, he left the mountain land of his youth, Jonothan Creek, Heyward County, N. C. and arrived in the gold country of Carroll County, Georgia. He is on record buying a 202 1/2 acre land lot no. 102 in District 6 in Carroll County. He paid \$400 to Joseph Thompson & Ransom Thompson on 24 October, 1830. (The deed was not filed until 21 May, 1837). A note on the deed said "..the said Thompson is to have half the interest in the gold on said lot.."

This plot of ground is about 2 miles SW of present day VillaRica, Georgia, and is known today as Hickory Level Road. He may have induced the rest of his family to come to the gold fields at Villa Rica. In February, 1832 his father bought LL 235 in District 2 and moved his whole family there from Haywood County, N. C. . This plot is on Mud Creek in present day Douglas County at Hight Point Road. Jesse's land and his father's land was about four or five miles apart. On Nov 1, 1832 he and his father, Joseph went together and bought land in Carroll Co. land that had an existing mine on it. The newly discovered gold mine was on LL 195, District 6. Jesse H. and his father Joseph borrowed \$3500 and mortgaged their property to buy the gold mine. They were to pay back \$500 every two months on the note. Records show that Jesse married Catherine D. Steed in Columbia County, Georgia on January 7, 1837. On 23 March, 1839 Jesse was received into the New Hope Primitive Baptist Church at Villa Rica by emersion. "Distributions by church, 22 Feb., 1840." Jesse H. ordained a deacon at New Hope, 24 Apr., 1841.

US Census: 1840, Jesse lived in Carroll Co., Ga. 642nd Milita Dist. 2nd house from his brother John T. Chambers. Living with wife and one male age 20-30 in household, and 4 slaves. Jesse H. Chambers was listed on the 1842 Carroll County, Ga. tax list: with 4 slaves, 150 usable acres in LL195-2. Jesse H. and Catherine were dismissed from New Hope Church by letter 26 Feb., 1842 and apparently moved to Forsyth County, Georgia to farm, for in the 1850 census Jesse and Catherine were living and farming in Forsyth County. He is listed as a land owner in 1853 in Carroll County, Ga. tax digest, section 649-6. By 1860 he was living in Tyler, Smith County, Texas. On the 1870 census his address was Canton beat, Troupe post office, Smith Co., Tx. In 1880 Jesse was widowed and lived with his son in law Charles White in Tyler, Tx. Obit: "Departed this life at the residence of the Hon. G. C. White, in Tyler, Texas, on November 29, 1881, brother Jesse H. Chambers in the seventy seventh year of his age. Bother Chambers was born in Haywood County, North Carolina, 13 March 1805. When a young man he removed to Georgia and was married in Columbia County, Georgia to Miss Catharine D. Steed, January 5, 1837. He removed from Georgia to Texas in 1854 and soon after united with Ebenezer Church, Smith County." Taken from South Carolina Baptist Newspapers, Deaths, and Marriages 1866-1887.

Notes for CATHERINE D. STEED:

Catherine D. Chambers was received in the New Hope Primitive Baptist Church at Villa Rica by letter 25 May 1839. Catherine was dismissed by letter from New Hope in 1851. She and Jesse and the two children moved to Smith County, Tx. in 1854.

Noland, JP Witness; James Yates & Dr. W. M. Driskell (book C2-68)<sup>311</sup>, daughter of *MOSES MCCARLEY* and *LYDIA YATES*. She was born 05 Dec 1839 in Campbell Co., Ga., and died 17 Feb 1931 in Brownsville Community, Paulding Co., Ga. bd. Sweetwater Bap. Ch. Cem..

#### Notes for *JESSE HARRISON CHAMBERS*:

Jesse lived with his father and mother and helped farm until he was 25 years old. Two events happened in 1861 that would change his life thereafter. The Civil War started in April and Jesse was married on April 11 to Tabitha Sarah Jane McCarley of Villa Rica, Georgia. From Jesse's Confederate pension application papers in Georgia, we know that he Enlisted in the Confederate States Army in 1861 in Carroll Co., Georgia. He was assigned to Company G 19th Regt. Ga. Vol. Infantry. His father, Capt. John Chambers had formed Company I of the 19th Ga Vol Inf at Villa Rica and it is not known why Jesse did not enlist with his brothers in Company I. Jesse left the command Oct 1, 1864 at Richmond, Virginia, sick with the measles. He was sent to Rome, Georgia then home in 1864, as he had typhoid fever. Jesse's record also states that he served in Company E & F, Floyd's 1st State Troops. (This possibly could have been on his return to duty after the 1864 illness.) There also is a record of Jesse H. Chambers serving in the 10th Regt. Georgia Calvary, (State Gurards). After the war Jesse and Sara Jane lived in the Villa Rica Dist. of Carroll Co. Ga. next house to his father Capt. John Chambers (1870 Census). Published in the Carroll County Times, May 9, 1873: "90 Acres of land levied on the property of John D. Chandler's by virtue of fi fas issued in favor of the Justice of the Inferior Court (Carroll Co.) for use of Jesse C. Hill vs Jesse Chambers, principal, and John T. Chambers and John T. Hawkins, Securities" Jesse Chambers was in the # 1259 Connors Militia Dist. (Dark Corner area) of Douglas Co., Ga. (1880 Census), then Jesse moved his family to Cullman Co., Ala. about 1886. Jesse and Sara left two married daughters in Georgia, Lizzie and Vene, both married in South Paulding County, Georgia. Jesse's four sons, Bud, Jim, Bob and 9 year old Walt made the move and later all four married in Alabama. In 1900 Jesse and Sarah were living in Bailyton, Cullman Co, Ala. Their son Walter and his new wife Addie P. Martin and their new baby, Mamie, were living with them and farming. After retiring from farming in Alabama and before 1910, Jesse and Sara moved back to the Brownsville Community near Sweetwater Baptist Church in Paulding County, Georgia, and lived close to their daughter and son-in-law Vene and Newt Meadows. Jesse had a cancer on his eye in his later life.



He used arsenic to treat the cancer and was successful in stopping the cancer, but lost his sight in that eye and wore an eye patch for much of his life thereafter. Jesse's reason for application for Confederate Pension stated "cancer of eye, eyeball eaten out". His pension was denied 1910-1918. His obituary in the Douglas County Sentinel (Georgia) "Aged Citizen Passes Away: The Brownsville community was saddened this week (March 10, 1918) by the death of one of its oldest and most highly esteemed citizens, Uncle Jesse Cambers, who died at the home of his son in law Mr. J. N. Meadows. Mr. Chambers was 82 years old and was a Confederate veteran, a Baptist, and a Mason." On April 5, 1918, a Card of Thanks appeared in the Douglas County Sentinel as follows: "To our many friends and relatives who so willingly assisted us during the illness and last dark hours when death came unto our home and took our dear husband and father. May the Lord bless you all and comfort you in such dark hours is our sincere wish. Mrs. J. H. Cambers, Mrs. J. N. Meadows, Mr. J. N. Meadows and children." Jesse is buried at Sweetwater Baptist Church Cemetery, Douglas Co. Ga. It is interesting to note that in 1880 that Jesse and Sara Jane's neighbor who lived on the same road, five houses down, was Thomas Willoughby. Interestingly none of the Chambers and Willoughbys ever married even though both had large families, that is until 77 years later, when Jesse's great grandson Roger Smith who lived in Haleyville, Alabama, and Thomas's great great granddaughter Alice Byram who lived in Douglasville, Georgia met on a blind date, fell in love and were married, not knowing that their ancestors had been close neighbors in Douglas County, Ga. many years before.

#### Notes for TABITHA SARAH JANE MCCARLEY:

In the 1860 census of Carroll County, Ga. Sarah Jane was 20 years old and single, living at home with her parents. She was nicknamed "Puss" and all her nephews and nieces called her Aunt Puss. After husband Jesse died, she would ride the train from Douglasville, Georgia to Haleyville, Alabama to visit her three sons Walter H., Jim, and Robert P. families. Sometimes she would bring her grandson Roland Meadows on the train with her. Sarah Jane lived in Brownsville with her daughter and son-in-law, Vene and Newt Meadows during her last years. Roland said when the train crossed to Tallapoosa River coming back to Georgia, Grandma would say, "Roland, we're crossing the Tallapoosy and it won't be long now". Those that knew Tabitha Sara Jane said she had a knack for saying what she thought, and had a lot of devilment about her, all in good fun. She lived to the age of 92 and died at the home of her daughter Vene Meadows. Death Cerf. #4367. Her sense of dry humor was passed to some of her children. She is buried in the Sweetwater Baptist Church Cem. on the Brownsville Road, Paulding/Douglas line. Sherrie Moore Buckelew, ggg

granddaughter, who lives at Eva, Alabama has one of Aunt Puss' dresses that was passed down through the generations.

After Cora died in 1949, Bob and Mary married and lived together for 10 years until Bob died in 1959. Bob and Cora and Mary are buried at Corinth Heights Bapt. Cem, Haleyville, Al.

Mary's sister Cora, who was married to Robert P. Chambers in Haleyville, Ala. In the 1920 Census of Haleyville, Mary was single and living with Cora and Robert. Notes for WALTER "WALT" HARRISON CHAMBERS:

Walt was born in the home of his Uncle J. K. P. "Jim" McCarley in 1877 near Douglasville, Ga. The year Walt was born, his uncle James Madison Heaton was elected the 2nd mayor of Douglasville. When he was 12 years old, in 1889 his parents moved to Joppa, Cullman Co., Al. from Brownsville, Douglas Co., Ga. Walt and Pearl Martin married in 1898 in Cullman, Co. They lived with Walt's father and mother the first year or two, they were there in 1900 while they all lived at Bailyton, Cullman County. Mamie was born at Bailyton. They moved to Haleyville, Winston Co. in 1906 to the Isom Cheatam place. In the 1910 Census of Winston Co. Walt and Pearl's neighbors were Isom Cheatam and Jeff Donaldson on the Newburg Road two miles north of Haleyville. Walt built a new home and tore down to the old house where they had lived for two years. On the 9th of Nov. 1912 Walt and Pearl bought the "Stanley Place", which was adjacent to the new home. It was 53.7 acres and they bought it from J. G. Donaldson for \$575.46 and secured the deed with a mortgage note for that amount to J. G. Donaldson. They paid 200.00 on the note on Nov. 21, 1913, 250.00 Feb. 5'th 1915, and 185.59 on Jan 15, 1916. Walt was required to register for the WWI Draft and he did on Sept

12, 1918. He stated on the registration that he was 41 years old and was born on Jan 17, 1877. His home was at Haleyville, Winston Co., Ala. He was a farmer and listed his next of kin as his wife, Addie Pearl Chambers. Altogether Walt owned about 88 acres, all located adjoining the Newberg Road, 2 miles from Haleyville. On this land they farmed and they raised their children. Walt split all the wooden shingles for the roof of the house and the barns. The new house was of one floor with 5 large rooms, a open hall and large front and back porch. Later, as the family grew, two more rooms were made from the hall and one end of the back porch. The room on the back porch was always called the "Little room". Felix, the black and tan hound, and maybe his offspring, made their bed under the porches. Later Pete and Joe the hounds made their home there too. The house originally had lattice work under the sills to the ground, in the 1950's Walt underpinned the house with rock. Under the front of the house was the entrance to the cellar where the canned goods and benches were found. The benches were for refuge from the "bad" storms that passed through in the spring and summer and fall. There were two double fireplaces for heat and a wood burning stove in the kitchen. A large woodshed stood to the side of the house, open on the side facing the house. A smokehouse was to the rear of the kitchen. Usually two to four hogs were killed in the late fall and the hams and sides cured in the smokehouse and the other meat salted down in the salt boxes. Between the smokehouse and the woodshed was a large apple tree that was a delight to climb by the children and grandchildren. Beyond the apple tree was the privy. Behind the woodshed was the grape vineyard, and below the vineyard was the hog shed and pen. Near that was the big beech tree that the hogs were hung on at killing time. Across the road in front of the house was the big barn where the animals were fed, the cows milked and the fodder and the corn sheller stored. The wagon was kept in a shed adjoining the barn. Also under this shed were plows and implements of farming, including the ground sled. The ground sled was used to transport the plow and fertilizer to the field and sometimes a grandson got to ride to the field. The log stable was in front of the barn, it consisted of two stalls, the last two mules to make their home there was Ned and George. In addition to their regular plowing duties, Ned and George presented a challenge for the many grandchildren who delighted in riding the mules. It was no small task for the grandchildren to chase the mules to the log barn and put the bridles on and then figure out a way to get up on the mules back. Usually the mount was done from the wall in the stable and if you could get out the stable door with out getting dragged off by the low clearance of the door frame you were ready for hours of fun riding around the farm. The mules didn't seem to mind most of the time, but sometimes they would balk and want to go back in the stable, so no matter how hard you pulled on the rein they just went right ahead and you had to duck again for the door or get dragged off again. In front of the stable next to the road was the corn crib. Ater retiring from farming in about 1950 Walt and Pearl sold their farm and home for \$8,000 and moved about 1/2 mile toward Haleyville on the Newberg Rd. into a house that Luther Guttery had built and lived in. They lived there until their death, except Walt's last months, which were spent in Kelly's Nursing Home in Haleyville. Walt and Pearl and their children attended Prospect Baptist Church from 1906 until about 1910 when they then moved their membership

to newly organized Corinth Baptist Church on the Dime Rd. Walt was a talented musician. He taught "singing schools" at church and played the organ at church in his early years. Walt owned a pump "parlor" organ in his home and played for the family as they gathered around to sing the old favorite gospel hymns. With the help of a neck harness, Walt could play the harmonica and the organ at the same time. There exists a taped session of the family singing. The organ and the tape are in the possession of Benny Roger Smith, Sr. grandson of Walt. Walt was also an excellent farmer. He studied the latest in agriculture and was apt to use the best methods of farming. He changed from cotton farming after the boll weevil devastation and planted large apple and peach orchards for cash crops. After his retirement from farming he raised strawberries for sale and had a mink ranch on his two acre place. Walt was a Rosevelt Democrat and kept up with current events through the paper and radio and liked to discuss issues. He was a sportsman. Before he retired from his farm, he had a three hole golf course and a croquet court in the pasture. His farm was a favorite gathering place on Sunday afternoons when, soon after lunch neighbors and friends would show up for the games. They would also pitch washers and horseshoes. The women folk would gather on the large front porch of the house and visit while the men played. Walt died in 1970 at the age of 93.

Notes for ADDIE PEARL MARTIN:

Born in Carroll Co., Ga. 1883, moved with parents to Hulaco, Morgan Co., Al. when she was a child. Born Pearl Mae, she took her sister's middle name because she didn't like Mae. She renamed herself Addie Pearl. She attended church at Hebron Church of Christ, Hulaco, Morgan Co., Al. before she married. Married at age 15. Mother of nine children and nineteen grandchildren. Dipped Rooster snuff. Her greatest asset was her love and devotion to her family. I lived next house to her on the Newburg Road, Haleyville, Alabama all my youth, and I just knew I was her favorite grandchild. (BRS)

Value \$1400.00 #730 Militia Dist (Town) Ga.
